East Leake Playground Consultation 2012

Drop-in Sessions Summary January 2013

Objectives

- To improve the provision of equipment and the overall environment of the playground areas in East Leake focussing on the Gotham Road Playground and Oldershaw Trust Land.
- To provide a safe, secure environment for our children to play in promoting a healthy lifestyle and stimulating development through play.
- To encourage people to come into the village promoting social interaction and engagement whilst providing an enhanced consumer base for local businesses.



Local Support

East Leake Community Plan Group extracted preliminary data from their recent survey of those living in the village (40% response rate).

- 'The children's play facilities are in need of improvement', 41% of respondents agreed or strongly agreed with this statement (695 respondent responses analysed so far).
- 'Refurbishing the playground facilities within East Leake (priority 1-4)', 53% ticked the high priority boxes 1 (21%) and 2 (32%) (688 respondent responses analysed so far).
- Clearly illustrates that the refurbishment of the playground is a priority to those living in East Leake.



Consultation Summary

- Held two drop-in sessions where people were free to drop in and express their views
- Posters put up around the village and on the East Leake website and ELCP facebook page.
- We asked people to complete a short questionnaire and a picture tick sheet.
- Also consulted children and parents at 'Messy Church' and Brownies (Guides have recently contacted us).
- And received emails in response to the poster and also emailed friends.


Questionnaire


- Designed a questionnaire to ensure consistency. Completed by parents and children, sometimes in a group or individually (all responses recorded total of 105 responses recorded).

- Asked what equipment they would like to see in the park and gave them the opportunity to look at brochures and highlight equipment of interest.















What equipment would you like to use in the park?




Sand Play Area



East Leake Playground Consultation Group

So what's this all about?

East Leake Parish Council has set aside £15,000 each year for the next 5 years to refurbish the children's playground areas within East Leake. The recent East Leake Community Plan questionnaire identified that half of those who responded felt that refurbishment of the playgrounds within East Leake was a priority.

Which playgrounds will be refurbished?

Although the focus is on the Gotham Road playground, due to its central position, we are keen to look at providing play equipment in the Oldershaw Trust Land area (off the Costock Road). We want to find out more about your views on the East Leake playgrounds to ensure we focus our efforts in the right direction.

Who's organising these consultation sessions?

We are Liz, Felicity and Georgie and are three mums who live in East Leake with children of various ages. We contacted the Parish Council to express our views about the current situation with the playgrounds in East Leake and they invited us to join their newly established playground focus group.

Who's leading the playground focus group?

Parish Councillor Marie Males is leading the playground focus group and is part of the Parish Council's Amenities Committee. The mums offered to survey the wider community in East Leake and have organised two initial consultation groups (Thurs 15th Nov 7.30 pm at the Nag's Head and Sat 1st Dec 10-12 pm in the East Leake Library). More consultations will follow so we'll keep you posted.

So what happens now?

We'll collect your views and present them to the playground focus group and the Amenities Committee of the Parish Council. We'll continue to work with them to put proposals together for the refurbishment of local playgrounds and to apply for further funding to boost funds so that we can do more.

Summary and Future Directions

- Received 105 responses to our questionnaire with clear support for a refurbishment of the Gotham Road playground.
- Identified key equipment that both children and adults would like to see in the park.
- The park clearly needs to provide more variety and stimulating equipment especially for the over 5s.
- Providing a landscaped, well designed environment would support community engagement.
- We would like to proceed to the design phase with a company specialising in playground equipment.
- Further consultation with the community.
