Neighbourhood Development Plans

Localism Act 2011: regulations April 2012

New approach to planning: presumption in favour of development where no formal plans in place

Facility for communities to produce own plans and get them adopted

Neighbourhood Development Plans intended as way of devolving power to local people

Requirements for Neighbourhood Development Plans


No set format: can be simple or very complex

Need to be promoted by Parish Council, etc


Must be in line with national or local policies

Must be independently examined

Must be supported by majority voting in referendum



East Leake Community Plan & Neighbourhood Development plan



Community plan covers wide range of issues affecting village

Needs to involve other agencies

Neighbourhood Development Plan can be primarily a spatial plan

Focus on environment, movement and housing

Warm -up exercise

Each person takes two post-it stickers

On one, write what you think makes East Leake a great place

On the other, write what you think makes East Leake **distinctive** (how different from other villages)

Share your decisions with the rest of the group, and then group them together into similar categories on a flip chart page
