Adaptability







Building fronts and backs - the public front

For good surveillance and safe public spaces put the areas of buildings that need least privacy adjacent to the street. Maintain this relationship. An office, living room or kitchen are OK, a store room, WC or bathroom are not.



And we need a private back, a private outdoor space. If this is open to the public a screen of some sort is needed to maintain privacy. This screen blocks surveillance of the public space. Avoid this relationship.


